Notices of this regular meeting of City Council were provided to the media and individuals requesting a copy of the agenda informing them of the date, location, and time of the meeting.

CALL TO ORDER

Mayor Barnes called the October 13, 2025 Regular meeting of Florence City Council to order at 1:01pm.

INVOCATION

Pastor Chris Handley gave the invocation for the meeting. The pledge of allegiance to the American Flag followed the invocation.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

Councilwoman NeSmith-Jackson made a motion to adopt the minutes of the September 8, 2025 Regular Meeting and Councilman McKay seconded the motion. The minutes were unanimously (6-0) adopted, with Councilman McCall having not yet arrived.

[Councilman McCall arrived at 1:08pm.]



Councilwoman NeSmith-Jackson inquired about the total number of lots in the subdivision. Mr. Dudley estimated that each phase includes around 60 lots, so the total number would be between 180 and 200 lots.

Council voted unanimously (7-0) in favor of the motion. Bill No. 2025-40 was passed on first reading.

Bill No. 2025-41 - First Reading

An Ordinance to annex and zone NC-6.2 the parcel located at 922 West Sumter Street, identified as Florence County Tax Map Number 90060-09-037.

Councilwoman NeSmith-Jackson made a motion to pass Bill No. 2025-41 on first reading and Councilman Smith seconded the motion.

Mr. Jerry Dudley, Director of Planning, reported that the property on Sumter Street is an infill lot currently vacant with a small rear accessory structure and will be annexed into the city as an existing nonconformity. The property owner intends to develop the site under city standards, with a recommended zoning designation of Neighborhood Conservation-6.2 (NC-6.2).

Pro tem Jebaily referenced nearby properties that remain outside the city limits and inquired whether city water and sewer services are available to those lots. Mr. Dudley confirmed that city water and sewer are available to the subject parcel but noted he would need to review the maps to verify service availability for the surrounding properties. However, he added that water and sewer service is generally available in this area. Pro tem Jebaily discussed the presence of various "doughnut holes" throughout the city and expressed interest in whether access to city water and sewer services could encourage property owners to annex into the city limits. Mr. Dudley responded that most properties within the city's infill areas do have access to water and sewer services.

Council voted unanimously (7-0) in favor of the motion. Bill No. 2025-41 was passed on first reading.

INTRODUCTION OF RESOLUTIONS

Resolution No. 2025-30

A Resolution to adopt the City of Florence Sewer Collection System Master Plan.

Pro tem Jebaily made a motion to pass Resolution No. 2025-30 and Councilman McCall seconded the motion.

Mayor Barnes said Resolution No. 2025-30 was on the agenda last month. Although Council proceeded to vote on the Resolution, no formal motion or second was made; therefore, under parliamentary procedure, the Resolution did not pass.

Council voted unanimously (7-0) in favor of the motion. Resolution No. 2025-30 was passed.

Resolution No. 2025-34

A Resolution recognizing October as Domestic Violence Awareness Month.

Councilman McCall made a motion to pass Resolution No. 2025-34 and Councilwoman NeSmith-Jackson seconded the motion.



Mayor Barnes presented the Resolution to Ellen Hamilton, Executive Director of Pee Dee Coalition. Ms. Hamilton thanked Council for the recognition and presented the City of Florence with framed pictures of the Pee Dee Coalition's various facilities.

Council voted unanimously (7-0) in favor of the motion. Resolution No. 2025-34 was passed.

Resolution No. 2025-35

A Resolution of Recognition for Reverend Dr. Ralph W. Canty, Sr., honoring his dedicated service as one of the longest-serving pastors in the Florence area.

Councilman McCall made a motion to pass Resolution No. 2025-35 and Councilwoman NeSmith-Jackson seconded the motion.

Mayor Barnes presented the Resolution to Rev. Dr. Ralph W. Canty, Sr. Rev. Dr. Canty thanked Council for the recognition.

Council voted unanimously (7-0) in favor of the motion. Resolution No. 2025-35 was passed.

Resolution No. 2025-36

A Resolution pledging to practice and promote civility in the City of Florence.

Councilman McKay made a motion to pass Resolution No. 2025-36 and Councilman McCall seconded the motion.

Mr. Scotty Davis, City Manager, said the City of Florence pledges to practice and promote civility within the governing body. The elected officials of the City Council enact this civility pledge to build a stronger and more prosperous community by advocating for civil engagement, respecting others and their viewpoints and finding solutions for the betterment of the City of Florence. This pledge ensures all communication, both spoken and written, to be open, honest and transparent as this is vital for cultivating trust and relationships. This pledge ensures mutual respect to achieve municipal goals, recognizing that patience, tolerance and civility are imperative to success. This pledge ensures opportunities for finding common ground and engaging in civil discussions to seek solutions while actively listening and thoughtfully participating. Mr. Davis noted that this Resolution will be signed by all members of Council.

Council voted unanimously (7-0) in favor of the motion. Resolution No. 2025-36 was passed.

Resolution No. 2025-37

A Resolution certifying buildings as an abandoned building site pursuant to the South Carolina Abandoned Buildings Revitalization Act Section 12-67-100 of the South Carolina Code of Laws, as amended, regarding the property located at 262 West Cheves Street, Florence County Tax Map Number 90087-01-015.

Pro tem Jebaily made a motion to pass Resolution No. 2025-37 and Councilwoman NeSmith-Jackson seconded the motion.

Mr. Clint Moore, Assistant City Manager of Development, explained that when a developer is using abandoned building tax credits for redevelopment, one of the required steps is for the local municipality or government to pass a Resolution confirming that the building has been vacant for at least five years. Mr. Moore noted that this particular property has been vacant for several years.



Council voted unanimously (7-0) in favor of the motion. Resolution No. 2025-37 was passed.

Resolution No. 2025-38

A Resolution to approve a Conditional Grant and Development Agreement located within the Downtown Redevelopment District for a development located at 262 West Cheves Street.

Mayor Barnes said this item may be discussed in Executive Session. Without objection, this item will be discussed in Executive Session.

Resolution No. 2025-39

A Resolution and Conditional Grant and Development Agreement to provide an incentive for the development of new housing within East Florence as part of the ongoing Neighborhood Redevelopment Project.

Mayor Barnes said this item may be discussed in Executive Session. Without objection, this item will be discussed in Executive Session.

Resolution No. 2025-40

A Resolution authorizing Staff and the City Attorney to utilize the eminent domain process to the extent necessary to acquire ownership of the property described on Exhibit "A" hereto for the public purpose of the expansion of the existing fueling facility.

REPORT TO COUNCIL

Appointments to Boards and Commissions

Mayor Barnes said this item may be discussed in Executive Session. Without objection, this item will be discussed in Executive Session.

Appointment to the PDRTA Board of Directors

Mayor Barnes made a motion to reappoint Pro tem Jebaily to the PDRTA Board of Directors and the motion carried unanimously. Pro tem Jebaily was reappointed to the PDRTA Board of Directors for a term to begin September 2025 and expire August 2028.

Appropriation of Accommodations Tax funds for Fiscal Year 2025/2.6.

Mr. Tim Norwood, Chairman of the Accommodations Tax Advisory Committee, presented on behalf of the Accommodations Tax Advisory Committee and provided the recommendation of the Committee for distribution of Accommodations Tax funds for FY 2025-26. The committee received proposals from 24 organizations, with funding requests totaling \$1.4 million. The committee was able to fund \$880,750 of the requests between 22 organizations, and is distributed among initiatives related to sports tourism, art, culture, convention and quality of life festivals. The appropriations report is attached to and made a part of the minutes.



Pro tern Jebaily made a motion to accept the Accommodations Tax Advisory Committee's recommendation of the FY 2025-26 distribution of Accommodations Tax funds and Councilwoman NeSmith-Jackson seconded the motion.

Council voted unanimously (7-0) in favor of the motion. The motion passed.

CITY MANAGER'S REPORT

Mr. Scotty Davis, City Manager, recognized Mr. Allen Heidler, Police Chief, for 42 years of distinguished service as he retires from the Florence Police Department.

Sheriff TJ Joye, Florence County Sheriff's Office, and Mrs. Allison Carraway, widow of Sergeant Terrence Carraway both recognized Chief Heidler for his dedicated service and wished him the best in his retirement.

Chief Heidler thanked city staff, Council and everyone for the recognition and reflected on his career with the Florence Police Department.

Mr. Davis also recognized Councilman McCall, Councilman McKay and Councilman Smith for being named among the 2025 Best and Brightest 35 and Under by the Pee Dee Business Magazine. This recognition highlights young leaders across South Carolina who are making a meaningful impact early in their careers.

MAYORAL REPORT

Mayor Barnes acknowledged that the Pee Dee Ice Cats hosted their inaugural game on October 10th. She also recognized the event held on October 9th to honor Dr. Iola Jones, which was presented in partnership with Francis Marion University and the Housing Authority of Florence. Mayor Barnes noted that the Community Empowerment Walk, originally scheduled for October 11th, was canceled due to inclement weather. However, she commended the dedication of community members who still showed up despite the rain.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

Business Development Committee, Chaired by Pro tem Jebaily

Pro tem Jebaily reported that the committee received a presentation from Andrew and Nicole Agha regarding the site work at the location of the old Gamble Hotel, where the new Urban Square apartments will be developed. Several artifacts discovered during the work will be donated to the City and Florence County Museum, with some potentially displayed inside the new apartment building. The committee also received an update on Urban Square, noting that the contractor has turned on the lights at the adjacent warehouse building.

Community Development Committee, Chaired by Mayor Barnes

Mayor Barnes said that the rescheduled date for the Community Empowerment Walk is Saturday, November 8th at 11:00am.



Finance, Audit and Budget Committee, Chaired by Councilman McCall

Councilman McCall reported that the committee received a presentation from the Accommodations Tax Advisory Committee on their recommendations for Fiscal Year 2025/26. The committee also received a presentation from First Tryon Advisors about the city's plans for the bonds it will receive between now and November 2025. Additionally, there was a discussion regarding the airport and its potential expansion.

EXECUTIVE SESSION

Mayor Barnes said Council will be entering into Executive Session to receive legal advice on the unauthorized camping ordinance, Bill No. 2025-39, for a discussion of an economic development project as referenced in Resolution No. 2025-38, for a discussion of an economic development project as referenced in Resolution No. 2025-39, to receive legal advice on the eminent domain process relation to Resolution No. 2025-40, for a discussion regarding appointments to city Boards and Commissions, to receive information on an economic development project for property located in a downtown overlay district, to receive legal advice regarding a potential lawsuit, to receive an update on an ongoing economic development project and for a personnel matter.

Councilman McKay made a motion to enter into Executive Session and Councilwoman NeSmith-Jackson seconded the motion. Council voted unanimously (7-0) to enter into Executive Session at 2:06pm.

Pro tem Jebaily made a motion to resume open session and Councilwoman NeSmith-Jackson seconded the motion. The motion carried. Council resumed open session at 3:43pm and took action on the following items:

Bill No. 2025-39 - First Reading

An Ordinance to amend Chapter 17 of the City Code of the City of Florence to add Article IV and provisions related to regulating improper use of public place and urban camping and other matters related thereto.

Pro tem Jebaily made a motion to pass Bill No. 2025-39 on first reading and Councilman McKay seconded the motion.

Mr. Clint Moore, Assistant City Manager of Development, informed Council that similar ordinances have been enacted in other municipalities, including Columbia and North Myrtle Beach. He explained that the proposed ordinance would allow the City of Florence to manage the overuse or obstruction of public rights-of-way and public spaces. In cases where items or personal belongings are found to be encumbering these areas, the City would be able to connect individuals with appropriate services, while also ensuring that such spaces remain accessible for general public use. The ordinance will apply to all public rights-of-way, downtown plazas, and city parks.

Councilman Braddock inquired whether the ordinance would apply to all public spaces. Mr. Moore confirmed that it would.

Pro tem Jebaily made a motion to amend the motion to provide that the City Manager shall meet with No One Unsheltered and that the City Manager conduct a study that shall address education, service needs and enforcement matters as it pertains to the homeless population, along with the inclusion of homeless court as an option to address potential infractions under the ordinance and further move that following



this review the ordinance will then be placed on the December 8th Council meeting agenda for consideration of second reading and Councilman Braddock seconded the motion.

The motion to amend carried unanimously (7-0).

Council voted unanimously (7-0) in favor of the motion, as amended. Bill No. 2025-39 was passed on first reading, as amended.

Resolution No. 2025-38

A Resolution to approve a Conditional Grant and Development Agreement located within the Downtown Redevelopment District for a development located at 262 West Cheves Street.

Pro tem Jebaily made a motion to pass Resolution No. 2025-38 and Councilwoman NeSmith-Jackson seconded the motion.

Council voted unanimously (7-0) in favor of the motion. Resolution No. 2025-38 was passed.

Resolution No. 2025-39

A Resolution and Conditional Grant and Development Agreement to provide an incentive for the development of new housing within East Florence as part of the ongoing Neighborhood Redevelopment Project.

Councilman Smith made a motion to pass Resolution No. 2025-39 and Councilwoman NeSmith-Jackson seconded the motion.

Council voted unanimously (7-0) in favor of the motion. Resolution No. 2025-39 was passed.

Resolution No. 2025-40

A Resolution authorizing Staff and the City Attorney to utilize the eminent domain process to the extent necessary to acquire ownership of the property described on Exhibit "A" hereto for the public purpose of the expansion of the existing fueling facility.

Councilwoman NeSmith-Jackson made a motion to pass Resolution No. 2025-40 and Councilman McKay seconded the motion.

Mayor Barnes inquired whether the property could only be used to expand the fueling facility or if it could also be used for greenspace. She pointed out that having fueling pumps visible from the road might not be aesthetically pleasing. She then asked if this issue needed to be addressed before approving the Resolution or if it could be handled afterward. Mr. Ron Scott, City Attorney, clarified that Council could certainly amend the language to allow for fueling facilities or other related components. Mayor Barnes reiterated her concern about the visibility of fuel pumps from the road. Mr. Scotty Davis, City Manager, responded that while there are buffer requirements for the property, any use of the land through eminent domain must also serve a public purpose.

Council voted unanimously (7-0) in favor of the motion. Resolution No. 2025-40 was passed.

Appointments to Boards and Commissions

Mr. Davis presented the packet of appointments to Boards and Commissions to Council.



Accommodations Tax Advisory Committee

Pro tem Jebaily deferred his nomination to the Board.

Councilman McKay made a motion to appoint Jennifer Hunt to the Accommodations Tax Advisory Committee and the motion carried unanimously. Jennifer Hunt was appointed to the Accommodations Tax Advisory Committee for a term to begin immediately and expire on June 30, 2028.

Design Review Board

Councilman McCall deferred his nomination to the Board.

Construction and Maintenance Board of Adjustments and Appeals

Mayor Barnes deferred remaining nominations to the Board.

Parks and Beautification Commission

Councilman McKay made a motion to appoint Ross McMillan to the Farks and Beautification Commission and the motion carried unanimously. Ross McMillan was appointed to the Parks and Beautification Commission for a term to begin immediately and expire on June 30, 2030.

Resilience and Sustainability Advisory Committee

Councilman Smith deferred his nomination to the Board.

Public Safety Citizen's Review Board

Councilman McKay deferred his nomination to the Board.

DEPARTMENT/DIVISION: Department of Planning, Research & Development

I. ISSUE UNDER CONSIDERATION:

A request to annex Tax Map Numbers 00100-01-384 through 00100-01-443 as well as 00100-01-093 into the City of Florence and assign them the zoning designation of RG-3 (Residential General-3). The request is being made by the property owner.

II. CURRENT STATUS/PREVIOUS ACTION TAKEN:

On September 9, 2025, the Planning Commission held a public hearing regarding the annexation of these lots and voted unanimously, 6-0, to recommend the zoning designation of RG-3.

III. POINTS TO CONSIDER:





I. ISSUE UNDER CONSIDERATION

For City Council consideration is a resolution authorizing the City Manager to reappropriate funds to local food banks within the City of Florence in response to the federal government shutdown and the temporary suspension of Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) benefits. The resolution ensures that distributions are supported by reimbursement requests from the recipient organizations and that all recipient organizations are recommended and approved by City Council.

II. CURRENT STATUS/PREVIOUS ACTION TAKEN

No previous action has been taken on this ordinance.

III. POINTS TO CONSIDER

- 1. The resolution authorizes the City Manager to reallocate up to \$60,000 in existing budgeted funds to provide temporary food assistance to residents affected by the shutdown and loss of SNAP benefits.
- 2. All fund distributions must be recommended and approved by City Council prior to disbursement.
- 3. Any disbursement of funds under this Resolution shall be made on a reimbursement basis, with recipients required to submit documentation verifying the use of funds.
- 4. All funds must be used solely for the purchase, distribution, or coordination of food and essential nutritional items for Florence residents.

Approve and adopt the proposed ordinance.

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO REAPPROPRIATE FUNDS TO LOCAL FOOD BANKS IN RESPONSE TO THE FEDERAL GOVERNMENT SHUTDOWN AND THE ENDING OF SNAP BENEFITS, PROVIDED THAT SUCH FUNDS ARE SUPPORTED BY REIMBURSEMENTS FROM SUPPORTED ORGANIZATIONS

- WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Florence recognizes that the ongoing federal government shutdown and the suspension or reduction of Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) benefits have created an immediate and severe hardship for many Florence residents; and
- WHEREAS, local food banks and community organizations are experiencing increased demand for food assistance as a direct result of these federal program interruptions; and
- **WHEREAS**, the City of Florence seeks to ensure that residents continue to have access to essential food resources while maintaining the fiscal stability of city operations; and
- **WHEREAS**, City Council desires to authorize a limited, reallocation of funds to support food security efforts without reducing or impairing current municipal services;

NOW, THEREFORE, BASED UPON THE FINDINGS OF FACT SET OUT ABOVE, IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FLORENCE, SOUTH CAROLINA:

- a. The City Manager is hereby authorized to reappropriate up to Sixty Thousand Dollars (\$60,000) from existing budgeted funds, provided such reappropriation shall not directly impact or reduce any current city services, programs, or personnel for the citizens of Florence.
- b. The funds may be distributed to one or more local food banks or nonprofit organizations within the City of Florence that provide direct food assistance to residents affected by the federal government shutdown or the lapse of SNAP benefits. All such distributions shall be recommended and approved by City Council prior to disbursement.
- c. All disbursements of funds under this Resolution shall be made strictly on a reimbursable basis. Recipient organizations must submit itemized documentation and receipts evidencing eligible expenditures before reimbursement is issued. Reimbursements shall be limited to actual costs incurred for the purchase, distribution, or coordination of food and essential nutritional items, ensuring proper accountability and verification of all funds expended.
- d. All funds provided pursuant to this Resolution shall be used exclusively for the purchase, distribution, or coordination of food and essential nutritional items for Florence residents in need.

This Resolution shall become effective immediately upon its approval by City Council.
